I hereby certify that I, Nizam Peerwani, M.D. have performed an autopsy on the body of Child Jane Doe (MC Doe 64) at the Tarrant County Medical Examiner's Morgue on the first day of May 1993, and that the said autopsy revealed:

FINDINGS:

- O1 Evidence of inhalation of carbon monoxide with liver carboxyhemoglobin saturation of 56%
- 02 Focal areas of body charring
- 03 Gunshot injuries cannot be ruled out
- 04 Advanced postmortem decomposition

CAUSE OF DEATH:

- 01 INHALATION OF CARBON MONOXIDE DUE TO FIRE
- 02 FOCAL CHARRING

Regarding the circumstances involved in the demise of the decedent, please refer to the inquest investigation report prepared by the Justice of Peace.

A complete autopsy is carried out at the Tarrant County Medical Examiner's Morgue by the authority of Judge James Collier, Justice of Peace, Pct 2, McLennan County, Texas

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

Body is presented to the County Morgue co-mingled with other bodies in the "Bunker" with sorting performed by Dr. Owsley. The separated body parts are presented for autopsy wrapped in a white sheet.

Body is clad in markedly soiled and focally heat damaged blackened garments including:

- a. pink short sleeve T-shirt, size 1 with defect on left side
- b. multicolor floral print pants
- c. one left white sock with pink trim
- d. one left white sandal, size 5 with heat damage to the toe area
- e. soiled diaper.

Large number of ordinance are submitted with the body, piled into a heap and include:

- a. 22 unfired 7.62mm caliber magnetic bullet
- b 01 unfired 7.62 mm caliber non-magnetic bullet
- c. 03 exploded 7.62mm steel cartridge cases
- d. 01 unfired 7.62x39mm caliber cartridge
- e 10 exploded 7.62x39mm caliber cartridge cases
- f. 03 unfired .223 caliber bullets
- g. 01 unfired .223 caliber cartridge with crimped top (blank)
- h. 01 .223 caliber exploded cartridge case
- i. 03 9mm caliber exploded cartridge cases
- j. 03 .22 rimfire caliber exploded cartridge cases
- k. 01 exploded 7.62x51mm caliber cartridge case
- I. 11 primer caps

Body is disarticulated mainly because of advanced postmortem decomposition with the disarticulated parts co-mingled with decomposing soft tissues including viscera. Focal areas of charring are however noted. Submitted for examination are:

- separated skull with disarticulated mandible. The skull is incomplete with missing occipital and left temporal bones. There is slight heat related blackening of the left parietal area without significant charring. Separated and decomposing fragments of scalp are also present with long blonde hair. Skull contains minimum residual less than 5.0 grams of putrefactive tissue. Facial bones are intact with adherent putrefying tissue. Traumatic injuries are not identified.
- large mass of soft tissue and viscera with co-mingled ribs, vertebrae, scapulae, sternum and most of the bones of the extremities. Osteological sorting reveals all the major bones to be present, examination of which reveals absence of traumatic injuries. Minimal fire damage is noted and the disarticulation is mainly due to advanced decomposition.

On examination and sorting of the soft tissue, a 32 gram segment of liver and 28 gram segment of lung is identified. These are devoid of pathology or trauma.

External genitalia are not distinguishable because of advanced state of decomposition.




